Director's Column

The MRHS Board of Directors suggested that I write a series of columns, using each word of our name as a jumping off point to explain what MRHS is all about. So let's begin with "Morningside."

It's no accident that Morningside Heights Housing Corporation and Morningside Retirement and Health Services sound similar. MRHS was founded by Gardens residents in 1966 with the support and backing of MHHC. While the primary motive for MRHS's founding was the concern of residents for their neighbors who were growing older and frailer, MHHC management was also concerned about a rising tide of complaints, unpaid maintenance fees and sanitary issues in some apartments. So MRHS was given free office space to establish headquarters, with the understanding that by addressing these and other social ills MRHS would lessen the toll on MHHC, including costs related to legal actions. I think this is called enlightened self-interest.

But "Morningside" doesn't refer only to MHHC. MRHS has relationships in the Morningside Heights community that reach beyond the Gardens. MRHS has a longstanding health care partnership with St. Luke's Hospital, which provides MRHS with visiting doctors. MRHS has a new health care partnership with Jewish Home Lifecare, located just south of Morningside Heights, providing us our nurse, Marie Phillips and our home health aide, Jennifer Paul. MRHS serves as a field site for interns from the Columbia University School of Social Work and we receive a grant from Columbia Community Service for the printing of this Newsletter each month. Columbia also graciously provides us with the Pulitzer World Room in the School of Journalism building each year for our Spring Recognition Luncheon. MRHS receives support from local elected officials in the Morningside community, including Assembly Member Daniel O'Donnell and City Council Member Mark Levine.

NORC (naturally occurring retirement community) programs such as MRHS work most effectively when they act as a hub of activity, accessing resources in the surrounding community for the benefit of residents. The first word in MRHS refers to our connection to this wider community.
