Emergency Preparedness



Since its inception in 1966, MRHS has been a "grassroots" kind of an organization. Not only was it founded by Gardens residents on their own initiative, it continues to rely on the community for support in terms of time and resources. MRHS listed 193 volunteers by name in our last Annual Report and almost 250 households made a donation to our annual fund campaign last fall. We are grateful to every volunteer and donor. Occasionally, we like to recognize a Gardens resident who stands out because of her or his generosity. Winifred Shearer (pictured above), who passed away in 2012, was such a person.

Winnie gave generously of her time, answering telephones and greeting guests at MRHS on Friday afternoons for many years. Winnie was also generous by including MRHS in her will, leaving us a bequest of more than \$275,000, which will help pay for our upcoming renovations. I came to know Winnie rather well over the years. She was a quiet, unassuming, low-key kind of person. Winnie was a very capable individual, the kind of person who could be left alone minding the office if staff had to be off on errands for short periods of time.

Sitting at the volunteer desk on Friday afternoons, Winnie had an opportunity to see the work of MRHS on a daily basis. She saw our social workers going out to meet with clients in their homes; she saw Margaret Bianchi patiently assisting guests with a range of requests and tasks; she saw our nurse Marie Phillips responding to requests for help at home or in her office. I think it was seeing MRHS working, close-up and personal, that inspired Winnie to be so generous towards us. She truly believed in the mission of MRHS, of enabling older adults to remain living in their own homes and community. I'm happy at this time to recognize Winnie Shearer's generous contribution to MRHS.

New York State Farmers Market Nutrition Program

Thanks to the New York City Department for the Aging, MRHS has been provided with vouchers to be used at Farmers Markets as part of the "New York State Farmers Market Nutrition Program." Booklets of vouchers worth \$20 are available from MRHS on a first-come, first-served basis. *There is a limit of one booklet (\$20 value) per household.*

The state requires that each recipient sign a "Statement of Eligibility," indicating that you are at least 60 years of age and meet the following income limits:

- Below \$1,815 per month for a one-person household
- Below \$2,456 per month for a two-person household
- Below \$3,098 per month for a three-person household

Or

Currently receiving or eligible to receive SSI or public assistance.
